**Registration:**

To join the Library please complete the registration form available on the Library Blog or from Library Staff. You will be issued with a barcoded library card and all personal details provided will be stored on the SWIMS Library Management System in accordance with the relevant data protection regulations (*see the Data Protection statement below*).

**Access:**

The Library is staffed as indicated on the back of this guide but in addition is available 24/7 by swiping into the Academy with a Trust ID badge. If you are a user from another organisation, then please register with Staff at the main hospital reception on level 3 who will be able to help you gain access to the Library.

**Borrowing Books:**

Members of the library may borrow up to 12 books for 28 days. Please bring your books to the Library front desk to be issued. For out of hours borrowing we operate a paper system for which there is a guide at the issue point.

Renewals where possible are available from staff at the issue desk, by email and by phone. In addition, you can access your record and renew your books online at [www.swims.nhs.uk](http://www.swims.nhs.uk) where you can also search the Library catalogue. The SWIMS Library catalogue contains all book stock held in NHS Libraries of the South and West.

Returned books can be handed to staff at the issue desk, or left in the book returns box. Please do not place returned books directly onto the shelves. We do not charge fines, however we reserve the right to invoice for the replacement cost of any lost or non-returned items, plus an additional £10.00 for administration.

**Items not in our stock:**

Request forms for books or articles not in our stock are available from staff and can also be found on the Library Blog. Complete one form for each item including your name and department. There may be a charge for this service unless the item is required for clinical purposes so please ask a member of staff for guidance.

**Printing, Scanning and Photocopying facilities:**

A photocopier/printer/scanner is available in the IT Suite. Personal printing is charged at 5p per page – please pay the Library Staff. Copyright regulations are displayed next to the machine.

**Computers, Laptops and Headphones:**

There are both Trust password protected and open access PC's in the IT Suite which can be accessed 24/7. In addition, there are Trust password protected laptops and headphones available for use in the Library during office hours. These will be issued to your SWIMS Library card. Wi-Fi is available in the Library providing internet access for your own devices.

# Library Training

The Library Team offer a variety of one-to-one sessions to help equip you with the skills needed to perform an efficient literature search. We break these up into bite-sized pieces to fit in with your free time; however, we are happy to tailor all sessions to your skills and requirements. The time indicated for each session is just a guide as we are happy to accommodate your particular needs. Please ask the Library Team if you would like to book some time with one of us.

## **Before you start:**

Registering for an NHS OpenAthens account and familiarisation with the resources available when using this, such as the electronic resources within this guide and on the Library Blog, the e-LfH searching modules and more.

Time to allow: 30mins-1hr

## **Simple searching guidance:**

Learn about searching for topics and scoping for information before you decide what you are going to research in detail.

Time to allow: 30mins-1hr

## **Framing the question:**

How to create a well thought out question before you start to search the Healthcare Databases.

Time to allow: 30mins-1hr

## **Assisted searching (introduction):**

This offers help on how to search the Healthcare Databases in a systematic way using Boolean operators and free text.

Time to allow: 2hrs

## **Assisted searching (advanced):**

This builds on the previous session to familiarise you with more advanced searching techniques such as using controlled vocabulary, truncation, limits etc.

Time to allow: 2hrs

**Assessing your results:**

The session aims to give you a basic understanding of how to analyse the quality of your search results and will guide you through some of the tools and techniques available to appraise them.

Time to allow: 2hrs

**Referencing:**

This session provides guidance on the tools and resources available to help with referencing, alongside individualised help to make sure that the referencing in your work complies with the required standards.

Time to allow: 1hr

**Health Literacy:**

This session aims to give you an understanding of what health literacy is and why it is important, including tools and techniques that can be used to aid and support someone who has low health literacy.

Time to allow: 1hr-2hrs

**E-Learning:**

E-Learning is available to compliment the above Library training. The e-learning includes programmes on 'how to search the literature effectively' and 'health literacy'.

These programmes are available through e-Learning for Healthcare. Information on how to access e-Learning for Healthcare can be found towards the end of this guide.

NB: If you are already familiar with some of the techniques required for searching and would like a more condensed searching session then please ask as we can adapt to your needs.

We can also offer training in line with the above sessions to be delivered to groups of staff, for example during peer support/departmental meetings. If this approach would be of interest then please email the Library to discuss your requirements.

For access to many of the resources contained within this guide you will need an NHS OpenAthens account.

How to register:

Visit [www.openathens.nice.org.uk](http://www.openathens.nice.org.uk) preferably from an NHS networked computer. Complete the online form using an NHS or University email address if possible to speed up the authorisation process. An activation link with your new username will be sent to this email account which will allow you to create a password.

Registering from a home PC is possible but could delay your application by up to 15 days.
